Dear Members,

A recent song by Crowder is titled "All my Hope". The chorus, "All my hope is in Jesus, thank God my yesterdays gone. All my sins are forgiven. I've been washed by the blood." This song hits home in many ways, because far too often I think back to things I have done in my past, or even yesterday that go against God's Word or Commands. An issue develops if I cannot release those things, because it creates grudges against others, or a feeling of being unworthy. Either result prevents something so fabulous that it actually leads to unnecessary suffering.

The unnecessary suffering is explained in the chorus of the song discussed above. We suffer greatly when we forget that our hope is in Jesus, that the sins of our past have been forgiven, and that we have been washed in the blood of Jesus. Maybe we should focus there for a second. What does it mean to be washed in the blood of Jesus?

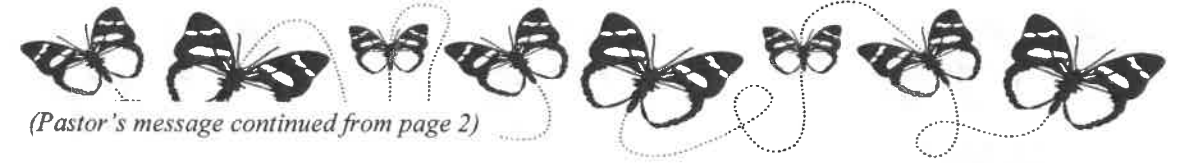
When we as Christians recognize that Jesus took on a great deal of suffering, pain, agony, and went to the cross for us, we also must recognize that something completely wonderful took place. As Jesus hung on the cross, His blood ran down. As His blood ran down, not only did it cleanse us as it flowed, but it cleansed all of creation as it touched the ground beneath Him. Through His blood, the final sacrifice; Jesus paid the price for all of your yesterdays, sins, and failures. You are REDEEMED!!!!

Therefore, as I think about that, and listen to the song, I focus on the fact that I am redeemed, yet, I still struggle with the question: what if I am not enough? What if all that I have done is not enough when I get to heaven? What if I stand before the throne of God, and I hear the words you were not a faithful servant, because you did not do enough? What if God looks at me and says, "I have no time for you because you had no time for me? What if????

See what doubt causes! See what failures lead too! See what focusing on the past creates! It creates issues with salvation. Yet, the truth is that there is not an issue with salvation. Salvation is sealed in the blood that flowed from Christ on the Cross. It is sealed in Christ's last words, "it is finished."

Yesterday is gone, but today is another story. However, how can we focus on what God has called us into today if we are focused on what we did yesterday, last week, last year, or decades ago? The truth is that we can't, and it is a tactic of the devil to keep us suffering in the wrong way. When the devil keeps us in the midst of failure, then we cannot focus on our faith, our calling, or the truth.

The truth is that through faith in Jesus, which is backed by His suffering, death, and resurrection, salvation is guaranteed. Neither you nor I need to worry about our salvation, our shortcomings, or the things that we fail to do! All we need to do is wake up in the morning and say a little prayer. Regardless, of what time of day it is, stop for a second,



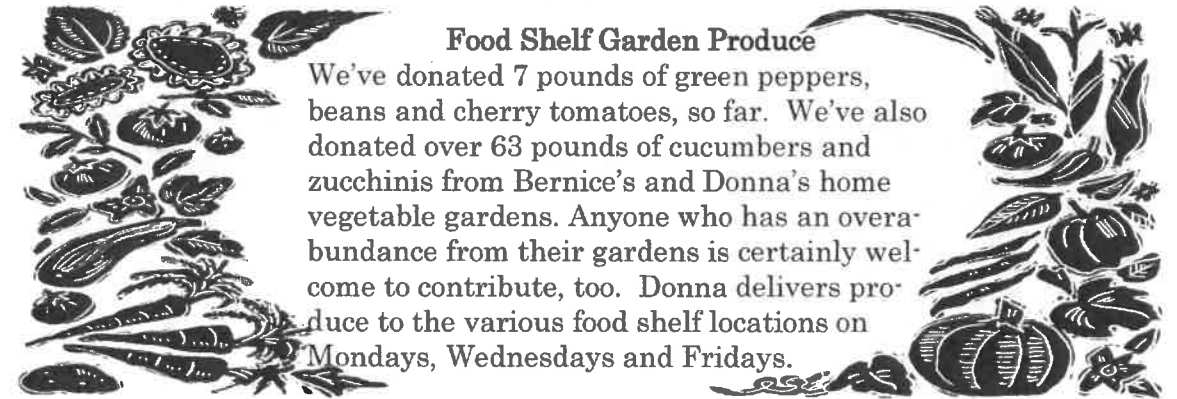

and pray with me, "Dear God, You are my hope, You have sealed my salvation through the suffering and death of Your Son Jesus Christ. Because He died, He paid the price for all of my sins, and not only cleansed me with His blood; He REDEEMED me in His blood. Therefore, I know that salvation is mine through Him and Him alone. In that knowledge fill me with the desires of Your heart, and guide me today to share the good news with myself and everyone I come into contact with. Keep me from doubt, and secure me on solid ground, that ground being Jesus Christ, my Life and my Salvation. In Jesus' name. Amen"

Now pick up yourself and walk! Your sins have been forgiven through the blood of Jesus. Remember that gift is yours forever. Not a free gift to do whatever you want, but a saving act for when you sin. In that moment turn to Jesus, repent of your sin, and remember His blood has now cleansed you. Release it, live in Jesus' peace and comfort, and go forth a forgiven and redeemed child of God.

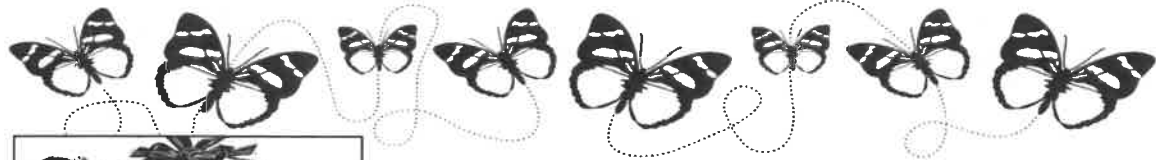


Food Shelf Garden Produce

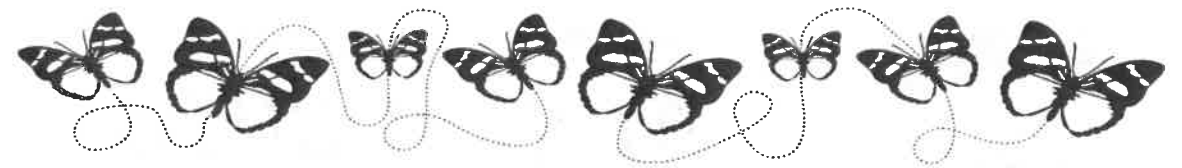

LWML MN South Convention Update Delegates voted to set the MITE Mission Goal for 2018-2020 at **\$265,000**. \$198,750 (75%) will be available for the 13 Mission Grants selected during the convention and \$66,250 (25%) will be sent to the National LWML to fulfill that goal of \$2,075,000.

I'd like to thank you for sending me to the Minnesota South District Convention as the delegate from Family of Christ. It was a great experience.

It was fun to be with 325 Delegates and Pastors as a Community of Believers. The pastors were so fun and helpful, they get a let crazy when let out of their church zoos. I was able to attend a seminar on the Supreme Court ruling titled, "Trinity Lutheran Church". Basically it ruled that any school, Charter, Parochial, Public are entitled to receive Federal funding, equally, for each student attending. If you would like more information email fred.hinz@mnsodistrict.org. I also picked up a printout entitled, "How to Respond to the LGBT Movement." A very eye opening article that will help make since of what we hear on a daily basis.

There are also Convention Resolutions that we voted upon. There are 6 Committees that develop about 7 resolutions in various categories. The most interesting was: "God created

the world in six days, with a seventh day for rest, each day consisting of 24 hours. Holy Scripture is inspired by God the Holy Spirit and is without error and infallible. Holy Scripture teaches the historical event of the creation of the first man, Adam, who was made in the image of God and that death came into the world as the consequence of his sin." It is assumed that it passes to reaffirm what the Lutheran Church Missouri believes. This is not the belief of all Synods in the Luther church.

The most amazing, glorious experience was the Worship service the first night. 12 Pastors in their robes and 4 acolytes processing the cross of Christ as 400 voices sang "Praise to the Lord, the Almighty" with true joy and praise, accompanied by an organ and brass quartet. It sounded like the Heavenly angels praising God. I was so excited to sing, "This is the Feast" Liturgy 1 and ending with, "Sent Forth By God's Blessing" It was definitely awe inspiring. "I THOUGHT YOU WERE GOING TO LEAD ME NOT INTO TEMPTATION."

A man named Jack was walking along a steep cliff one day when he accidentally got too close to the edge and fell. On the way down he grabbed a branch, which temporarily stopped his fall. He looked down and to his horror saw that the drop below him was more than a thousand feet, and he couldn't hang on to the branch forever.

So Jack began yelling for help, hoping that someone passing by would hear and lower a rope or do something.

"Help! Help! Is anyone up there? Help!"

Jack yelled. No one heard him. He was about to give up when he heard a voice, "Jack, Jack. Can you hear me?"

"Yes, yes! I can hear you. I'm down here!"

"I can see you, Jack. Are you all right?"

"No! Yes! But, who are you, and where are you?"

"I am the Lord, Jack. I'm everywhere."

"The Lord? You mean GOD?"

"That's me."

"Oh, God, please help me! I promise that if You get me down from here, I'll really be a good person. I'll go back to church and serve you for the rest of my life."

"Easy on the promises, Jack. Now, here's what I want you to do. Listen carefully."

"I'll do anything, Lord. Just tell me."

"Okay. Let go of the branch."

"What?"

"I said, let go of the branch. Trust me. Let go."

There was a long silence.

Finally Jack yelled, "Help! Help! Help! Is there anyone else up there?"

So live that no matter what happens, it wouldn't happen to a nicer person.

God so loved the world that He did not send a committee.

Fight truth decay - Read the Bible.

If you're headed in the wrong direction, God allows for U-turns.

Some go to church to take a walk;
Some go there to laugh and talk;
Some go there to meet a friend;
Some go there their time to spend;
Some go there to meet a lover;
Some go there a fault to cover;
Some go there for speculation;
Some go there for observation;
Some go there to doze and nod;
The wise go there to worship God.



When it comes to stewardship, a favorite Bible verse is the account of the widow's mite (Luke 21:1-4). It's a moving account. Our Lord praises the seemingly small gift of two copper coins given by a poor widow above the abundance of gifts given by the rich, saying, "Truly, I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all of them" (Luke 21:3).

And that is usually where we stop. But the text goes on. "For they all contributed out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty put in all she had to live on" (Luke 21:4).

"She ... put in all she had to live on." She gave everything. She held nothing back. She trusted that the Lord who made her and all creatures, who gave her everything she had, who redeemed her from her own sin, from death, and the power of the devil, who called her by the Gospel and enlightened her with His gifts of Word and Sacrament, would continue to do this. He would provide her with all that she needed for this body and life because that is the character of the God she had.

But this is not why we give small gifts. Her gift, though it appeared small, was actually large. When we are tempted to give small gifts it is precisely because we want them to be small! We don't trust the Lord to provide for us.

We give small gifts because we lack faith in the One who created us, redeemed us, sanctifies and keeps us in the one true faith. We give small gifts because we doubt that God will really give us what we need and desire. We give small gifts because we are not content with what God has already given.

We are not slaves, children of the slave woman, under the Old Covenant (Gal. 4). We are adopted sons of the free woman. And since

we are sons, we are also heirs. And heirs receive the inheritance. For everything is already ours in Christ. And thus, moved by the willing spirit of adoption, we do the will of God in financial matters far beyond all that done by those under the Old Covenant who were forced by legal demands.

So what have you decided to give? How do I decide what to give? Let the Scriptures be your guide.

We are to give proportionally to what we have received from God's giving to us (Luke 12:48; 1 Cor. 16:1-2, 2 Cor. 8:12). But you have not been set free to give nothing. See that you excel in the grace of giving (2 Cor. 8:7).

We are not free to live selfishly outside the Gospel, without regard for God who gives us all good gifts, without generosity for our neighbor who needs us and our gifts, without supporting the community of faith in which we live, without care for our spiritual fathers and those who teach and help raise our children in the faith, without resources for the poor and needy - in short, we are not free to live unto ourselves, hoarding what God has given us only for us.

For love is the fulfillment of the law (Romans 13:10). And the sum of the law is this: Love God and love your neighbor (Matt. 22:34-40). We love because He first loved us. We give because He has given to us.

Luther once said, "Possessions belong in your hands, not in your heart" (LW 14:240). There is a reason your 10 fingers spread apart. With your hands you catch God's gifts for what you need and let the rest fall through your fingers to your neighbors - your family, your friends, your community, your church.
